- **Did you know?:**

- **Activity:**

1. Epping Forest

- **Did you know?:**
Epping Forest is a name that comes from an ancient Forest in Erst Essex, England
- **Activity:**
How many pools are visible on the Estate?

2. Women's Club of Jacksonville

- **Did you Know?:**
The land on the river cost \$125.000 and the house cost "only" \$60.000 in 1926.
- **Activity:**
How much did the house and river cost altogether?

3. 2821 Riverside Avenue Jacksonville

- **Did you know?:**
This residence is a Prairie Style house? You can tell from the many horizontal lines
- **Activity:**
The roof of this house resembles mostly what kind of shape?

4. Riverside Baptist Church

- **Did you know?:**
When you sit inside the church you see a bluish light from above, due to the blue-tinted windows?
- **Activity?:**
What shapes can you see is the church made up of?

5. 2755 Riverside Avenue Jacksonville

- **Did you know?:**
This house was designed by famous Architect: H.J.Klutho
- **Activity:**
How many feet is this house away from the river?

6. **3225 St. Johns Avenue-** Kahler Apartments
 - **Did you Know?:**
This house was converted into condos in 1984.
 - **Activity?:**
How many rectangles can you count in the center window?

7. **4 East Bay Street Jacksonville-** DYAL UpChurch
 - **Did you Know?:**
This was the first tall building that was built in the downtown are after the fire of 1901.
 - **Activity:**
Count how many windows, facing East Bay Street, does the building have?
EXclude the arch doorways on the ground.

8. **101 E. Adams Street-** Free Public Library
 - **Did you Know?:**
There are 4 columns in the front of the library. You can see the faces of "great man of knowledge" on them: Plato, Aristotle and Shakespeare.
 - **Activity:**
What do you think the white rectangular grid is used for on the roof?

9. **219 Newnan Street Jacksonville-** Morocco Temple
 - **Did you Know?:**
Two Sphinx-like statues guard the entrance to the Morocco Temple.
 - **Activity:**
How far away are these statues from the Sphinx located in Cairo, Egypt. Answer in miles.

10. **314 Palmetto Street Jacksonville-** Old St. Luke's Hospital
 - **Did you Know?:**
City's oldest hospital building. Built to provide for penniless or ill travelers. Served victims of the 1888 yellow fever epidemic and those of the Great Fire of 1901.
 - **Activity?:**
Measure the circumference of the hospital's roof.

11. **Hemming Plaza**
 - **Did you Know?:**
The confederate monument is one of the few remaining survivors of the Great Fire in 1901
 - **Activities:**
What is the shape of the plaza?

12. **407 North Laura Street**-Old YMCA building

- **Did you Know?:**
The building had a swimming pool in the basement.
- **Activities:**
How many meters is this building away from the Jacksonville Landing?

13. **135 West Church Street**-First Baptist Church

- **Did you Know?:**
The dome inside the church was handpainted.
- **Activities:**
How many towers does the building have? How many circular windows are on the building?

14. **117- West Duval Street**-St. James building- City Hall

- **Did you Know?:**
The glass dome skylight is 75 foot in diameter.
- **Activities:**
What shape is the glass dome?

15. **235 West 7th Avenue Jacksonville**-Neo Classic Revival House

- **Did you Know?:**
The facade (the front) of this house is symmetrical.
- **Activities:**
How far is this house away from the Jacksonville Landing?

16. **1830 North Main Street Jacksonville**- Klutho's Apartment

- **Did you Know?:**
This house is a Klutho's Prairie-Style design. Lots of horizontal and vertical lines.
- **Activities:**
Measure the length of the roof in meters.

17. **30 West Ninth Street Jacksonville**-Klutho's Residence

- **Did you Know?:**
This was architect H.J. Klutho's own residence.
- **Activity:**
List all the shapes you see on the front of the house?
